

**TISBURY SCHOOL (4029)**  
**Enrolment Scheme**

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

**Home Zone**

**All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.**

- East end of Awarua Bay Road overland to Longbush South Road
- Longbush South Road to Tapper Road intersection
- Orr Road from Longbush South Road to Kennington Bluff Road
- Endowment Road from Kennington Bluff Road to the continuation of Endowment Road which is Wixon Road
- Overland from Rapid Number 86 Wixon Road to east end of Lardner Road
- Lardner Road and Judge Road
- North end of Judge Road then overland to Tramway Road East
- Tramway Road East to Rockdale Road
- Rockdale Road from Tramway Road to Boxall Street
- Boxall Street from Rockdale Road to Scott Street
- Scott Street from Boxall Street to Chesney Street Intersection
- Chesney Street to Ferguson Street excluding the Motor Camp
- Ferguson Street from Avon Road then overland to Rapid No 768 Bluff Road
- Bluff Road from Rapid No 768 to Colyer Road
- Colyer Road from Bluff Road to Siding Road
- Siding Road from Colyer Road then overland in a straight line to the coast

The zone includes all properties within the polygon created by the above includes all residences on both sides of the roads or sections of road.

Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

**Special Programmes**

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

**Out of Zone Enrolments**

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

| <b><u>First Priority</u></b>  | This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.       |
| <b><u>Second Priority</u></b> | will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.   |
| <b><u>Third Priority</u></b>  | will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.  |
| <b><u>Fourth Priority</u></b> | will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.  |
| <b><u>Fifth Priority</u></b>  | will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school. |
| <b><u>Sixth Priority</u></b>  | will be given to all other applicants.  |

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Under Section 11G (1) on the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

**Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.**
